#### For parents: A simple explanation for children:

Being able to discuss events with the unrecognised Jesus opened the disciples to the explanation of the Scriptures (Liturgy of the Word) and the sharing of a meal (Liturgy of the Eucharist) – essentially what happens at Mass today. It is like the Last Supper, the action of the breaking of the bread, that the recognition of Jesus is revealed to the disciples – the action of taking and of blessing the bread, breaking it and sharing it.

Understanding this story helps us to understand more fully what is happening at Mass- Holy Communion.

After the Gospel is read:

Reader: The Gospel of the Lord.

Children: Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ

#### **Gospel** Reflection Questions What do you remember from the story today?

- If something really, really sad happened to one of your friends, would you want to get away from it? When Jesus was put to death, some of his friends left Jerusalem and went to a place called Emmaus.
- How do you think they were feeling? (Confused, disappointed, sad)

When Jesus came up beside them and started talking to them, they didn't recognise him.

- How did they eventually realise that it was Jesus talking to them? (they got really excited when he was explaining Scripture to them and then when he shared a meal with them it was just like the Last Supper).
- When unexpected things happen to you (good things and not so nice things) how do you feel and how does having friends help you?

We are all made in the image of God and Jesus is in each and every person, but often we forget this. We need take the time to recognise how important and special each person is.

**Closing Prayer:** Living God, we look for you in all people. May we be inspired to treat each other with respect, sharing generously and reaching out to help those who are in need. Amen.

## **Activity Suggestions:**

- Invite the children to colour in the accompanying illustration of a group of people sharing food together and to write or draw on the back how they will treat others in the coming week.
- Enjoy doing the puzzles.
- Encourage the children to write a grace to be used before meals, so that each time they eat or share food they remember to look for Jesus in the people around them and in those who prepared, grew and produced the food.
